Player and Parent Agreement

PLAYER AGREEMENT

In registering as a Competition Player with Lakeside Netball Club Inc., the Player agrees to:

- I will play by the rules
- I will encourage and include my fellow players
- I will listen to and respect my coaches
- I will not leave the court during training without telling my coach

PARENT/GUARDIAN CONSENT AND AGREEMENT

When registering a child as a Competition Player, the parent/guardian verify the supplied date of birth. I give my consent to her/him becoming a member of the netball club run by Lakeside Netball Club Inc. (Club). I agree that:

- the Club may administer minor treatment to players on the court, including treating cuts and abrasions and bill the parent/guardian for any costs incurred that are not covered by the Club's insurance;
- I have provided the Club with contact details in case of an emergency. If the Club is unable to contact any of the player's parents/guardians, medical treatment can be administered to the player if deemed necessary by their Club for injuries requiring medical intervention under the direction of ambulance officers and/or qualified medical personnel;
I will comply with the Club's Code of Conduct and will ensure that any other person I invite
- to attend Club games and events is aware of the Club's Code of Conduct

In registering my child as a member of the Club, I:

- wish to become a member of the Club;
- support the purposes of the Club;
- and agree to comply with the Rules of the Club;
- follow the Netball Victoria Child Safety Standards (attached).

I consent to the use of photographic images of my child participating in Club activities being used in the Club's newsletters, website, and Facebook page or I have let the club know I do not consent.

PARENT/GUARDIAN CODE OF CONDUCT

The Lakeside Netball Club is committed to an environment that promotes tolerance, inclusion and fairness. We are inclusive club that welcomes and celebrate all players.

The expectations we have for parents/guardians associated with the Club are:

1. Encourage your children to participate, but do not force them;
2. Encourage children to play by the rules;
3. Never ridicule mistakes or losses;
4. Remember, involvement is for their enjoyment not yours;
5. Remember, children learn best by example: applaud all participants;
6. Recognise positively the contribution of the voluntary officials;
7. Never publically disagree with officials - raise any issues of concern privately;
8. Support all efforts to remove any verbal, racial, religious and physical abuse;
9. Recognise if your child is being disruptive, the volunteer coach may ask them to sit out activities temporarily so that the rest of the children can continue the activity;
10. Children will be expected to play and participate in drills and skills sessions with all the members of the team and an foster inclusive approach to play
